WHEN YOU SEE RIDERS ON THE ROAD PLEASE PASS WIDE AND SLOW

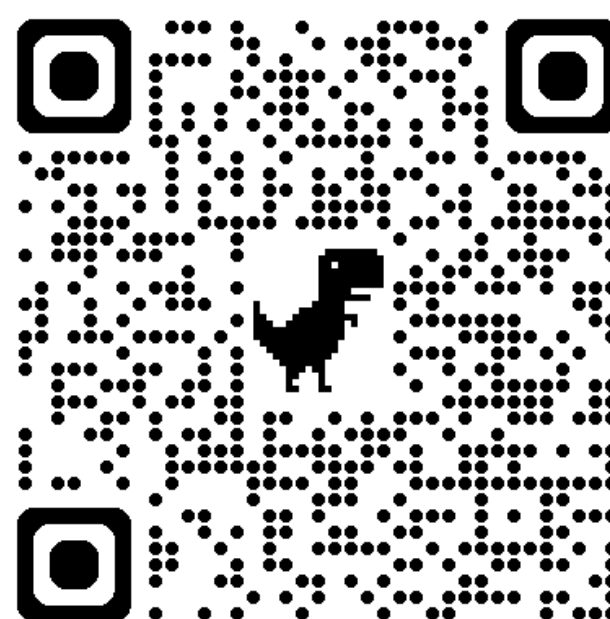
It's the behaviour we want all drivers across Aotearoa / NZ to follow when they see a horse and rider on the road. Allowing 2 metres between vehicle and horse means if the horse does get a fright or moves suddenly there is enough space between your car the the horse to keep everyone safer.
